



LANARK COUNTY OPP NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH UPDATE
05 January 2009

Almonte:

- 1) A black Issac Mizrahi men's leather jacket with a wallet in the pocket was reported stolen on the 27th of December 2008. The item was stolen between 8:00 p.m. on the 26th and 01:30 a.m. on the 27th when it was left unattended in a cloak room at the Almonte arena.
- 2) A pickup truck with a snowmobile in the box of the truck was reported stolen overnight on the 04th of January 2009. The truck described as a gray 2002 Chevrolet Silverado 4X4 with an extended cab had been parked in a residential driveway on Perth Street in Almonte when it was stolen. The snowmobile was a black 2001 Ski Doo MXZ 800 c.c. As of January 05th these items are still outstanding as stolen.

Beckwith Township:

No incidents to report.

Carleton Place:

- 1) A vehicle was reported rifled through overnight on the 23rd of December 2008. The incident occurred at a residential property on Charlotte Street.
- 2) The door handle of a car was reported damaged overnight on the 23rd of December 2008. The incident occurred at a residential property on Bridge Street between the 19th and 22nd of December. It is believed the handle was damaged when an attempt to get into the vehicle was made.
- 3) A business property located on Bell Street was reported broken into on the 25th of December 2008. A door was forced to gain entry at which time several bottles of alcohol were reported stolen.
- 4) Two tires on a passenger car were reported vandalized (slashed) overnight on the 25th of December 2008. The incident occurred at a residential property on Johnston Street.
- 5) A black and gold 1998 Infinity Incline adult male Mountain bike was reported stolen from a residential property on Munro Street on the 26th of December 2008. The theft took place between the 25th and 26th of December.
- 6) A residence located on Barclay Street was reported "egged" overnight on the 02nd of January 2009.

- 7) The right rear tire of a truck was reported vandalized on the 4th of January 2009. The incident occurred at a residential property on Flora Street within the previous week.
- 8) Two residences located on Joseph Street were reported struck with orange paint balls on the 02nd of January 2009. The incident occurred between the 25th of December 2008 and the 02nd of January 2009

Central Frontenac Township:

- 1) A door was reported forced at a residential property on Road 38 in the vicinity of Elizabeth Street in Sharbot Lake on the 28th of December 2008. The incident occurred between the 26th and 28th of December 2008. No items were reported stolen.
- 2) Two buildings in Arden were reported vandalized on the 02nd of January 2009. Both the post office located on Bridge Street and the Arden Public Library / Community Centre located on Arden Road were reported spray painted between the 1st and 2nd of January 2009. The post office had “DK” and an obscene word spray painted in gold at the rear of the building. The library was spray painted in several locations that included several obscene words, the letter “L” and a happy face also in gold paint.

North Frontenac Township:

No incidents to report.

Drummond/North Elmsley Township:

- 1) A stolen vehicle from Carleton Place was recovered in a ditch on Hand’s Road, south of Tennyson Road on the 23rd of December 2008 at 9:00 p.m. This vehicle, a blue 1992 Chevrolet Blazer S10 had been reported stolen from a residential property on Charlotte Street between the 22nd and 23rd of December and was previously mentioned in the Neighbourhood Watch Update on the 23rd of December 2008. Police received information that a suspicious male was observed in the vicinity at a residence on Hand’s Road where it is believed he was attempting to steal another vehicle at approximately 11:30 p.m. on the 22nd. He was last observed leaving the area on foot and is described as a male approximately 5’9” wearing a Tuff Duck jacket.
- 2) A suspicious vehicle was reported to police on the 29th of December 2008 at 5:30 a.m. after an ATV was observed parked unattended at Craig’s Shore (runs off of Tennyson Road, just west of John’s Marina) near other residences. Police attended and ascertained it was a person ice fishing. A good job of reporting suspicious activity. ☺
- 3) A suspicious vehicle was reported to police on the 01st of January 2009 after it was observed attending a residence located on Drummond Concession 9A in the vicinity of Highway 7 (east of Innisville). The vehicle left the area after being approached by a property owner. The vehicle is described as a greenish brown Oldsmobile, similar to an Allero.

Lanark Highlands Township:

- 1) A yellow 7 foot snow plough blade with a 3 point hitch assembly (used on rear of farm tractors) was reported stolen on the 19th of December 2008 from a residential property on Watson's Corners Road in the vicinity of 4th Concession A Dalhousie (just west of Watson's Corners). The stolen item is believed to have been stolen within the three weeks prior. A suspicious white Ford pickup truck was reported in the area during this time frame, however it is unknown if the truck is related to the theft or not.
- 2) A red 2003 Arctic Cat 400 All Terrain Vehicle was reported stolen on the 27th of December 2008 from a residential property on North Shore Road (runs off of 9th Concession B Dalhousie, north east of McDonalds Corners) in the vicinity of Sugar Bush Hill Lane Road. The theft occurred between the 23rd and 26th of December 2008.
- 3) A break and enter to a business property located on County Road 511 in Hopetown (north of Lanark) was reported on the 04th of January 2009. The incident occurred overnight with entry being made via a window. A quantity of cigarettes was reported stolen.

Montague Township:

- 1) Between 5:00 p.m. and 6:15 p.m. on the 20th of December 2008 a blue 1993 GMC Sierra pickup truck with a red western snow plough on the front was stolen from a residential property on McConnell Road (runs off of Burchill Road, south of Roger Stevens Drive, east of Smiths Falls). As of the 05th of January 2009 the item is still outstanding as stolen.
- 2) Several items were reported stolen overnight on the 27th of December 2008 from a garage located at a residential property on Kilmarnock Road, south of Kilmarnock. The stolen items include a Dell computer (with fire damage), Dell 19 inch monitor, two rings, a 20 foot electrical cable, 27 inch Panasonic television, golf clubs, Mitsubishi 4800 generator, and a ServiceMaster generator with a Honda motor.
- 3) On the 04th of January 2009 at 08:30 p.m. a suspicious person report was made to police after two men attended a residence on Matheson Drive in the vicinity of Rosedale Road South, east of Smiths Falls. The men indicated they were affiliated with a particular church/religion. Keep in mind that solicitation can occur and is not illegal if the organization is legitimate. However, always be cautious whom you open your door to, and before donating to any organization double check the credentials to ensure it is authentic.

Mississippi Mills Township:

- 1) A snowboard was reported stolen to police on the 02nd of January 2009. The stolen item is described as a 2008 black and white Tech 9 men's JIB Snowboard with red and white bindings. The snowboard was stolen between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on the 02nd when it was left unattended at the Pakenham Ski Hill located on Ski Hill Road just west of Pakenham.
- 2) On the 04th of January 2009 at 12:30 a.m. police responded to an alarm at a business property located on Highway 7 in the vicinity of Ramsay Concession 5A, west of Carleton Place. As there were tracks in the snow on the property it is believed the suspect(s) were attempting to steal an item, however were unsuccessful.

Tay Valley Township:

- 1) A mailbox was reported stolen on the 02nd of January 2009 from a residential property on Amyot Road (runs north off of Doran Road, north of Highway 7, west of Perth). The theft took place between the 31st of December 2008 and the 01st of January 2009.
